HISTORY OF LINDY'S LAKE

The property which is now known as Lindy's Lake was acquired by George Spinnler in 1926, who purchased the land with a small pond upon it from Frank and Cecil Shippee. It was the intention of Mr. Spinnler to retire, build a home on the pond for his own private estate. At that time the land was purchased, there were then standing on the property, two farm houses, both known as the Speaker Homesteads and were then over 100 years old. One of the farm houses was located where Mr. Harold Ahren's home is now situated and the other was destroyed by fire about ten years ago. It was replaced with the home which is next to the tennis courts. Our present Community House was the old cow barn, which was later converted into the dance hall and restaurant. Some of the old hand hewn timbers put together with wooden pegs are still in the structure.

In the year 1928, Mr. Spinnler decided to develop the property into a lake and in that year the Lindy's Lake Corporation was incorporated. It was just after Lindbergh's famous trip across the Atlantic and the lake was named in honor of him.

There were two cabins erected, namely Nos. 15 and 17 which were for the use of the Spinnler and Bouma families. The dam was then raised ten feet and then at a later date another 18 feet. New roads were laid through the mountains and around the lake and in 1931 electricity was brought in from the main road. Prior to that time, oil lamps and then gasoline lamps had been utilized. Then the artesian wells and fine water system were laid around the lake thus permitting us to have all the modern facilities of which we can boast and our fine sanitation. As time progressed, we added our recreational facilities such as the tennis courts, the baseball field, the fine beach and boardwalk.

In the year 1931, Mr. Spinnler erected his present home. There are approximately 500 lots around the lake and 150 dwellings. Lindy's Lake is one of the finest lake communities in North Jersey and we feel it is largely due to the fact that we have such fine property owners who earnestly work at keeping it so.

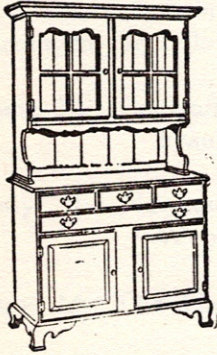
